- Described Willows PAC core values: community, parental engagement, student achievement, service
- The Willows PAC is:
 - o a volunteer-based organization and all volunteers are valued for making a huge difference
 - o focused on school-wide or grade-wide level events (eg. Grade 4 Bike Rodeo), usually not on projects specific to individual classes (If parents have an idea for these, contact the class rep. or the teacher)
 - The PAC is a fund-raising free zone with the exception of pizza and sushi day
 - Based on voluntary contribution system (suggested amount = \$40)
 - Letters will be sent home in October

This frees teachers, admin. staff, parents and children from constant time-consuming, ultimately less financially productive fund-raising activities

- o always open to new ideas, but there is a process (we cannot move very fast)

 - Raise new ideas at PAC meetings (they will be tabled for future discussion)
 - Some projects might be better without the PAC

Remarks from Steve Huxter, former Willows Pac chair, now Director on the Executive of the Victoria Confederation of PACs (VCPAC):

- Introduced the VCPAC (links 45 schools across Victoria)
- Does not advocate on specific issues (eg. WiFi in schools) but facilitates communication between schools on various issues
- Acts as mediator between PACs and British Columbia Confederation of PACs (BCCPAC)
- Two main VCPAC initiatives:
 - Advocate for appropriate services
 - Develop capacity of PACs (especially those struggling)
- Check out soon to be revised website: vcpac.ca
- Upcoming VCPAC Congress on October 3 (6pm, S.J. Willis School, 923 Topaz Ave.)

Remarks from Craig Mount, Earthquake Preparedness Chair:

- Explained where supplies (food, water, first aid kits, etc.) are placed on the school grounds in case of a seismic event, how
 they are purchased, restocked, etc.
- Explained the Great BC Shakeout (largest earthquake drill in North America)
- Answered questions about tsunami risk (low for our school's location), latex in first aid supplies (he will investigate) and food for kids with allergies (parents can contact him about individual kits for their children)

Remarks from Julie Chanin, Oak Bay Police Liaison:

- Thanked parents for showing up and for caring about the Willows community
- Being involved makes a huge difference for the children and the school

- Described briefly the WITS program for Grades K-3 and the LEADS program for Grades 4-5
